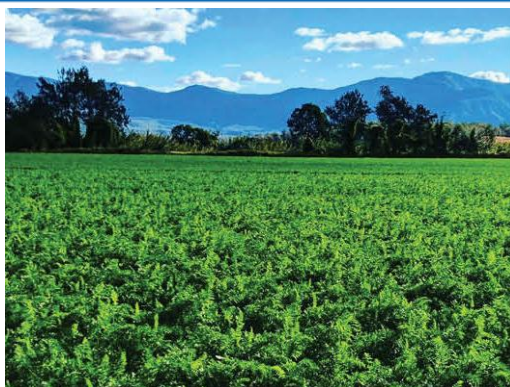


# Canola, Alternative Crops and Potassium Field Walk



## What:

Join the Department of Primary Industries and the Brigalow Farming Group to look at range of research and demonstration trials in the Jandowae region:

- Canola – See canola, wheat and lentil planted “early” and “late”. Hear establishment and nitrogen results from the last two years and explore where canola may fit within your farming rotation.
- Alternative winter crops – View options such as lentils, lupins, linseed, field pea and more, hear from researchers and marketers on the potential fit for these crops in the region.
- Deep Potassium trials – See the impact of deep K fertiliser in the new national GRDC potassium project and discuss whether you may benefit from applying it on your farm.
- On Farm Experimentation – Discuss on farm experimentation strip trial methods to validate small plot research in your own paddock.
- See Rick’s own canola planting rate, planting depth trials, long season and deep planted barley, discuss observed effects of 2025 canola crop, a soil pit to explore rooting depth.

Representatives from AGT, Pacific Seeds, NuFarm, Pioneer, Intergrain, Seednet and Bean Growers will also be present to discuss new varieties and their fit in our farming systems.
